



Baptism at Christ Church Longford

Christ Church Anglican is a beautiful historic church set in the manicured park grounds of Longford . We welcome the opportunity to walk with you and your family in this celebration of life and family faith.

Strong stable family life and a faith are wonderful attributes that parents bring to the well being for their children's happiness and future. Research shows that a strong sense of identity, a reasoned faith in God and a sense of both direction and hope prepare us well for adulthood.

All of this is to help the baptism service be a meaningful celebration for you as parents and for your family and friends.

In the meantime the Christ Church congregation welcome you and will be praying for your family as we look forward to your sharing with us.

What you must do

Confirm arrangements with the Rector, and complete the details on the 'Your baptism' application form. Please take care with the spelling of the full names as these are used for entry in the baptismal register and preparation of certificates.

Set a date for the baptism – Baptisms are usually on Sunday

- ☐ in the 9 am service by arrangement. This service is normally a Choral Eucharist and lasts about 60 minutes.
- ☐ after the 9am service often around 11.30 .
- ☐ at other times only by special arrangement with the Dean (especially in extraordinary circumstances: guests, godparents from the Mainland etc or in extreme pastoral need

Usually you should allow 8 weeks notice for preparation.

Is there a fee? – There is no fee. If you wish to make a thank offering that is up to you. A collection is taken both in the church service and at the baptism. Please inform your guests there is a collection.

Are you baptised? – At least one parent must also be baptised. If you are not baptised or confirmed and would like to personally consider this, please feel free to raise this and talk to the Rector . It is not unusual for one or both parents to seek baptism at the same time as their child's baptism.

Choose Godparents – In the Baptism service it says that children being baptised “need encouragement, teaching, and the help of a good example, so that they may learn to worship God, to pray to him, to put their faith and trust in him, and to take their place in the life of the Church” Godparents are those who are willing to help you in giving such help and encouragement. They should be people who can affirm their own Christian commitment in the service with you and who will regularly pray for your child and for you as the parents of their godchild.

Godparents are sometimes referred to as sponsors and usually should be over 18.

Is church attendance compulsory– We encourage you to attend church on at least one occasion before the day. Please introduce yourself when you come and we will look after you. There is more about this later.

Above all – Welcome! We look forward to meeting you and arranging your child's baptism

What is baptism?

Baptism is a sacrament or sign of God's grace to us in Jesus. The Bible teaches that God in his love and kindness sent his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ to live and die for the sins of the world. Through faith (believing trust) in the Son we receive salvation as a free gift from God. The sacrament of baptism marks the baptised out as Christ's.

Of course a baby has no personal faith but is baptised into the faith of his or her parents (that is why this occasion is an opportunity for us to question, perhaps rediscover, or discover more personally our own faith). Importantly in the service of baptism we, you as parents and your baby's godparents, together with the congregation pray that baby may ***be born again and made an heir of everlasting salvation.***

As a parent you want the very best for your child. We encourage you in this step of baptism because God's gift of eternal life and your child's relationship with God is fundamental for life's preparation, for hope and for personal assurance of the love of God.

What makes a family Christian?

We encourage parents to explore their own faith and their questions about hope, life and God. Faith and hope are two of the important dimensions to a strong and growing family life. Research shows that Christian faith strengthens both your marriage and family life.

It is easy to judge Jesus Christ by his followers. Many Christians are not always the best examples for the loving God of grace and kindness met in the Bible.

Jesus, the Son of God wants us to know his heavenly Father as God and friend. The gospels portray Jesus as a man of deep compassion and grace and love. He offers life to the full and teaches that eternal life is a hope we can know today and live by day by day. It makes a difference.

So a Christian family is one that has Christ and his example in it. This is a discovery not an imposition.

You may not have a firm understanding of Christian faith or you may not be a practising Anglican. Take this opportunity to re-examine your own beliefs and understanding.

We are not here to "brow beat" you but we do invite you to

- ❑ Do a short course (usually two sessions with the Rector, or with one of the Christ Church staff) on the Christian Faith as an opportunity to consider who Jesus is. We make these available at a time convenient to you.
- ❑ Reading at least one story of Jesus, known as a gospel. We will give you one in a modern easy read format. Or as DVD dramatic presentation
- ❑ Coming to services at Christ Church to experience Christianity in community. We love having children with us in the service and there is a vibrant Sunday School that runs during the main service

We do want to meet with you!

We will make a time to meet with you as soon as possible after the arrangements have been made. We will deal with some preliminary questions and then explain the meaning of baptism and explore any faith questions you may have. Godparents are welcome to come to these interviews.

We will go through the service and leave you with a copy of the service to both read and show others.

Questions you may ask might include “Why baptism?” “What is Anglican baptism?” “What are the candidates and godparents promising?”

Most of all, we want to help you grow in the faith into which you are baptising your child as we believe this is the greatest blessing we can bring to your family, to know that in Jesus we are part of God’s family and that he loves us.

What next?

We look forward to assisting you in the future with growing your child in the faith?

You will be invited to special services such as the children’s Christmas service. Or you may want to join the Christ Church or another Parish church. We can help you with these matters.

From time to time we run family courses or special functions and will advise you of these.

You may receive other promotional material from Christ Church .
